1. Welcome/Introduction

Brigham-Grette gave an introduction and explained that the workshop proposals and implementation plan were the big issues to be discussed.

2. Finances

Kiefer informed members about PAGES financial situation. EXCOM agreed to use the proposed \$30,000 for workshop funding.

Brigham-Grette reported on U.S. funding and that NOAA's contribution would be \$50,000. Paul Filmer, PAGES new NSF Program Manager, will be invited to the next SSC meeting in Mendoza.

Action Item: Kiefer to inquire about possibility of receiving extra U.S. NSF funds for participation of U.S. researchers at the Mendoza workshop.

There has been no further news from the Swiss NSF on the status of the proposal.

Kiefer reported that IGBP intends to increase funding, above the promised \$40,000, as compensation for the higher projected costs of the 2008 SSC meeting in South Africa, which will be held alongside the IGBP Congress.

There was an open discussion on funding issues. It was agreed that there was a need to acquire additional funding beyond the Swiss and U.S. NSF base to support the workshop mission of PAGES. This line item has suffered over the years due to inflation and the fixed funding level. ESF could be a sponsor for additional workshop support and has indicated interest (Bernhard Avril, EUROCORES Programme Coordinator). Wang suggested that additional funds for defined projects or PAGES working groups be raised from Asian countries, primarily China and Japan. The issue was tabled for further discussion at the next SSC meeting.

Action Items: IPO to contact ESF to discuss possibility of joint activities.

General discussion

The new workshop proposal submission form on the PAGES website was reviewed. EXCOM felt that the form had resulted in much better organization of the proposals than in the past. It was suggested that the form ask more directly about the workshop's relation to PAGES research structure, e.g., with check boxes for Foci/Themes.

Action Item: Include relevance to PAGES new science structure in workshop proposal form. Decision: As in the past, field trips will not be funded as part of workshops.

EXCOM decided to remain flexible about deep-time research if relevant to PAGES topics, treated quantitatively (e.g. by including modeling), and adding to process understanding.

Action Item: Develop strategy with DIVERSITAS at ESSP meeting on inclusion of deep-time paleoscience in topics addressing biodiversity and evolutionary processes.

5. PAGES Committees

EXCOM discussed changes to its membership and that of the SSC. Expertise required on the SSC includes marine, speleothems and ice cores. New SSC members should represent Eurasia and Asia.

Action Items: IPO to launch call for nominations, with emphasis on Asian and former Soviet Union countries.

EXCOM to start considering replacements for Wang and Battarbee. IPO to ask Solomina and Tada to suggest potential SSC candidates.

The proposed SSC task list was discussed and approved. It will be presented at the next SSC meeting and used in the next call for new SSC members.

6. PAGES Products & Activities in Progress

Products/Outreach

PAGES publications, website and outreach activities were discussed. There was general agreement that PAGES should remain involved if the Springer book series eventuates.

Suggestions for future newsletter special sections include:

- Africa, originating from the Central African PAGES workshop
- Polar/high-latitude paleoscience, IPY link (Mar. 2007 Mar. 2009), including BIPOMAC
- Past Human-Climate-Environment Interactions

Action Items: Battarbee to write report on HOLIVAR meeting for PAGES newsletter.

Chappellaz to produce French National PAGES.

Brigham-Grette to identify someone to update U.S. National PAGES.

Battarbee to consider producing U.K. National PAGES.

Scientific Activities

Kiefer reported on the recent Databoard meeting and PAGES commitments, including a data portal and revision of GCMD (Global Change Master Directory) keyword list.

Action Item: IPO to enlist help of SSC in revising GCMD keyword list for the Databoard.

Collaborations

EXCOM discussed ways in which PAGES could continue to collaborate with IPICS group

and activities, both on an organizational level as well as scientifically.

*Action Item: Chappellaz to discuss possible PAGES ESF activity with Eric Wolff.

PAGES relationship to CliC (WCRP) was also discussed. There was general agreement that sea-ice, and possibly also permafrost, is of joint interest. A link to PAGES would include longer timescales than the past 25 years, which are the focus of CliC.

Action Item: Chappellaz to contact CliC about potential for joint working group and/or workshop.

It was agreed that PAGES should explore collaborations with INQUA.

Action Item: Brigham-Grette to contact John Clague about PAGES contribution to 2007 INQUA Congress, joint activities, and joint SSC meeting.

The importance of close ties to AIMES was recognized. Chappellaz and Crumley are on the AIMES SSC and will attend the next AIMES SSC meeting in Victoria, Canada in September.

Action Item: Brigham-Grette to participate in next AIMES SSC meeting to explore possible joint activities.

EXCOM discussed PAGES involvement in IGBP, and how best to boost communication and joint activities with other core projects. Suggestions included asking IGBP to support small joint meetings between IGBP core projects to establish common research interest and joint initiatives. It was agreed to discuss this further at the next SSC meeting.

Action Item: Kiefer to explore with IGBP and core projects ways to hold strategic joint meetings between projects.

7. PAGES Calendar

Action Item: Rick to introduce PAGES new science structure as Session Chair (Focus 5) at ESSP conference in Beijing in November.

8. Office Update

9. Implementation of the New Structure

A major focus of the EXCOM meeting was on ways to implement PAGES new science structure. This issue will also be a major topic for the next SSC meeting. There the criticisms of the drafted new structure and the suggestions for amendments will be discussed.

Brigham-Grette proposed producing PAGES Science and Implementation Plan as a PAGES newsletter issue.

Science & Implementation Plan

EXCOM went over the proposed structure for PAGES Science and Implementation Plan and accepted the template as outlined. SSC members were assigned to prepare sections of the Science Plan as for the assignment to Foci and Theme build-up (see above). It was agreed that each group should prepare a draft for discussion at the next SSC meeting. Contributions from Focus/Theme groups should include:

- Science plan in draft form

- Implementation ideas (targeted implementation strategy in extended outline form)

Action Item: IPO to produce template and guidelines and send SSC request for draft sections of Science and Implementation Plan.

10. Miscellaneous

EXCOM considered ways to get involved in the IPCC 5th Assessment Report and tabled a strategy discussion for the next SSC meeting. It was noted that the theme of hydrates in the past and future was missing from the 4th Assessment Report and needed to be addressed.

All agreed that the next EXCOM meeting be held on the evening of 2 October, during the SSC meeting in Mendoza, and that there be no EXCOM meeting at AGU in December.

It was agreed to explore the possibility of holding the 2007 SSC meeting alongside the XVII INQUA congress (28 July - 3 August) in Cairns, Australia. This was tabled for further discussion at the next SSC meeting. It was noted that the upcoming series of SSC meetings could be used to boost coordinated Southern Hemisphere activities/synthesis:

2006 - South America Variability

2007 – Australasia Variability

2008 – Southern Africa Variability/Synthesis

Action Item: IPO to contact INQUA about the possibility of including PAGES in 2007 Congress in Australia (after Brigham-Grette has contacted John Clague).
