





British Diatom Meeting

Dear friends,

It gives me great pleasure to invite you to participate in the 2018 British Diatom Meeting.

This year's meeting will take place at the FSC Margam Discovery Centre, South Wales. The FSC is nestled within the 850-acre country estate of Margam Park. Margam Park houses several iron age settlements, Margam Abbey, Margam Castle, and the famous 18th-century Orangery. The park itself lies on the southern limb of the South Wales coalfield, with the spectacular panoramas of the Brecon Beacons just a short distance away.

The intention of the meeting is to provide a platform for amateur diatomists and academic researchers to discuss their work and all things diatom through poster presentations, informal discussions, and talks. As always, microscopes will be provided so participants are encouraged to bring along their favourite slides (it is also an excellent opportunity to draw on some expert knowledge and identify any species you are having difficulty identifying). The British Diatom Meeting aims to be informal and friendly, where ideas can be discussed openly among like-minded colleagues. The meeting will commence on the Friday evening and finish around lunch time on Sunday. There will be an opportunity to explore the surrounding countryside on Saturday afternoon, followed by evening activities and drinks.

Getting to FSC Margam Discovery Centre:

By train: There are frequent Great Western links from London Paddington, Reading, Swindon, and Bristol Parkway (connections from north east England and the Midlands) with Port Talbot station (approx. 5 miles from the FSC). Arriva Train Wales provide services to Port Talbot from Manchester, Crewe, and Shrewsbury. There will be several car trips provided throughout the day to ferry those arriving by train to the FSC.

By car: FSC Margam Discovery Centre is easily accessible off Junction 38 of the M4 Motorway. Parking is available.

Prices:

£110 = Student – Shared accommodation (dorm-style)

£135 = Shared accommodation (twin room)

£155 = Single accommodation (no limits this year!)

Included in the price is 2 nights' accommodation, breakfast (Sat/Sun), lunch (Sat/Sun), and evening meals (Fri/Sat) as well as tea and coffee.
