5. Reminder - ECR-led synthesis project seeking members

A product of the joint PAGES-INQUA early-career researcher workshop, 'Past Socio-Environmental Systems (PASES)', a new community-driven project has been funded by INQUA (2022-2023). The project, entitled '**The whole is not the sum of the parts: building a synthesis database of past human-environmental systems in the Global South (pSESYNTH)**' has the overarching objective of building the first-ever multi-themed database of past socio-environmental systems from the Global South. The project aims to test a key hypothesis i.e. whether or not cultural 'stress' of ecosystems is widespread across the Global South during the Holocene. By doing so, pSESYNTH will impose new ways to approach paleo-resilience equitably. Central to pSESYNTH is to reach out to the broader PAGES and INQUA communities and to foster new, long-lasting research collaborations among researchers exploring the Global South landscapes. - SEAK2022 - a virtual Workshop May 24-26 focusing on the natural history of SE Alaska, and neighboring regions along the British Columbia coast, will take place 24-26 May 2022. Organizers are seeking presentations on climate change, ice sheet dynamics, volcanic geohazards, Ice Age refugia, biodiversity, and biogeographic history. Registration is free. - The European Pollen Database (EPD) is planning an in person meeting in Prague **1-3 June 2022**, aiming to bring together palynologists and researchers using different proxies that may be archived in Neotoma (macrofossils, sedaDNA, charcoal, geochemistry, isotopes). We want to help maintain and foster the community of palaeoecologists using the EPD and Neotoma for data storage and analysis. - The new PAGES working group Pliocene and Miocene climate variability over glacial-interglacial timescales) launched in January 2022. The overall goal of Pliocene and Miocene climate variability over glacial-interglacial timescales) is to co-ordinate a synthesis of terrestrial and marine data to characterise spatial and temporal variability of Pliocene and Miocene climate.
