Speaking from their experiences on research ethics in universities, and as part of international academic organizations, Dr Feenstra and Dr Asrat Kassaye will provide their views on ethical implications of current publishing models and the impact of predatory journals and conferences. # 2. Call for speakers: webinar series 'Expanding our knowledge in the study of global changes'

The PAGES ECN Regional Representatives for Latin America are preparing to run a webinar series 'Expanding our knowledge in the study of global changes'. This will take place in the second half of 2023. This series is specifically designed for students and early-career researchers in the study of climate and global changes from their different areas.

The series aims to bring new perspectives to the study of past global changes, as well as encouraging enhanced collaboration, multidisciplinary approaches, and open science among early-career researchers. The organisers are currently seeking speakers to address the following webinar topics:

- Integration of ethnobiological, anthropological, and paleoecological perspectives.
- Quaternary paleoecology and nature conservation.
- Examining environmental studies through multiple temporal and spatial scales.
- Environmental science and policy: Open science and the integration of indigenous knowledge.
- Environmental economics: Evaluating the intersection of the economy and the environment.
- Human health and paleoenvironment: Exploring the connections.
- Conservation and restoration plans and policies.
- Forecasting global changes.
- Other related topic suggestions.

Did you know that the PAGES ECN runs a writing club?! Write Club is a great way to set aside non-negotiable time in your calendar for writing.

Each Write Club writing retreat runs for ~two hours, and is structured according to the 'Pomodoro' method: 25 minutes of uninterrupted, distraction-free writing, followed by 5 minutes of break time. Retreats are run by facilitators in different time zones, meaning that hopefully there should be retreats available at times that work for you. To make it even more fun, we also periodically run fun challenges, such as committing to write for an hour per day, and tracking your progress against that of your ECN colleagues.
