1. Call for nominations for PAGES Early-Career Award

The PAGES Early-Career Award (ECA) honors people in the early stages of their career (PhD students and <5 years after their PhD) for their engagement both within and beyond the scientific community. For example through (but not limited to) involvement in science coordination, outreach, networking, leadership activities, development of international collaborations and for excellence in research in support of PAGES' goals. The ECA will be publicly presented by PAGES at the next Open Science Meeting (OSM) in Shanghai in 2025. The awardee will receive a certificate, an invitation to present at the OSM, and a conference grant to attend the OSM (max. US\$2000). The deadline to submit nominations is **31 October**. 3a. Human Traces webinar series: Tackling the evolution and dynamics of the Anthropocene from sedimentary records in artificial lakes of Central Argentina: The water quality challenge

The Human Traces working group focuses on the long legacy of pre-Anthropocene human impacts. How do they manifest themselves in different parts of the world, and in different stratigraphic records? Human Traces aims to address the knowledge gap about spatial and temporal variations in early human impacts, with the overarching goal to create a global synthesis of human traces in geologic archives.

The Human Traces working group invites interested parties to attend a monthly Webinar Series. The next webinar is on the **20 October at 1400 UTC**, and will feature Dr Silvana Halac (Universidad Nacional de Córdoba) on the topic "Tackling the evolution and dynamics of the Anthropocene from sedimentary records in artificial lakes of Central Argentina: The water quality challenge". 4. Humboldt International Climate Protection Fellowships: seeking applications from researchers from non-European developing and transition countries

The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation International Climate Protection Fellowships are intended for prospective leaders and postdocs with climate expertise, from non-European developing and transition countries (see <u>Fellowship website</u> for list of eligible countries).

If you are a prospective leader you will do a one-year research-related project in Germany as part of your fellowship; if you are a postdoc, long-term academic research (12-24 months). It should focus on combating climate change, adaptation strategies, preserving ecosystems and biodiversity, or on the sustainable use of the seas and oceans.

Applications close **1 February** each year, so you have plenty of time to plan, write, and submit an application for this excellent opportunity. 5. Future Earth seeks applications for 2023 Early-Career Fellowship

The Early-Career Fellowship (ECF) is a pilot program launched in 2022, which aims to implement the development concept of innovation, coordination, openness, and sharing, and help promote the achievement of sustainable development goals. The ECF program is organized by Future Earth Global Secretariat Hub China with support from China Association for Science and Technology. The mission of the ECF program is to provide a forum in which early-career researchers from various disciplines (e.g.,

natural, social, and human sciences) can share their interdisciplinary research, pursue unique collaborations, and build a network of colleagues who can share their interest in improving the global sustainable development goals. ECF funds are relatively unrestricted and the recipients will enjoy sufficient independence, flexibility and a built-in support network during his/her tenure as ECF fellow. - Integration of ethnobiological, anthropological, and paleoecological perspectives.
- Quaternary paleoecology and nature conservation.
- Examining environmental studies through multiple temporal and spatial scales.
- Environmental science and policy: Open science and the integration of indigenous knowledge.
- Environmental economics: Evaluating the intersection of the economy and the environment.
- Human health and paleoenvironment: Exploring the connections.
- Conservation and restoration plans and policies.
- Forecasting global changes.
- Other related topic suggestions.
