The Paleoclimate Modelling Intercomparison Project (PMIP) has launched PMIP WINGS (PMIP Web-based INteractive Global Seminars), an online seminar series to benefit anyone interested in palaeoclimate modelling. Seminars will be held approximately once per month, on the last Thursday of the month.

The June seminar will feature talks from Masanobu Yamamoto on "CO₂ reconstruction based on Indian C3/C4 vegetation changes over the past 1.46 million years" and Axel Timmermann on "Simulating 3 million years of Earth history with a CGCM". 3. Train-ME: fully-funded summer school in sampling and coring methods

Applications are now open for the <u>Training</u> School on <u>Methods in Applied Earth and</u> Aquatic Sciences (Train-ME). Train-ME is a summer school aimed at students, doctoral candidates, and junior scientists in Germany and southern Africa (South Africa, Namibia, Angola, Zambia, Mozambique, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Lesotho). It takes place in Richards Bay, South Africa, from 24-30 September 2023 and covers training in sampling and coring methods in terrestrial and aquatic settings. The summer school is fully funded (travel, accommodation, subsistence). Application deadline is **15** June.
